## **HTML tips:**

In HTML, everything is in pairs. For example, both angle brackets and tags appear only in pairs.

A start tag does not have a /. Examples: <html>, <p>, <h1>

A end tag starts with a /. Examples: </html>, </p>, </h1>

An empty tag ends with a /. Examples: <br />, <hr />

A start tag always has an end tag.

Everything between a start tag and an end tag is called an element.

There should be no untagged text within an HTML document.
